SERVING AT SOLID ROCK

One of the beautiful things about following Jesus is that He not only saves us, but invites us to become part of what He is doing in the lives of other people.

Christianity was never meant to be a spectator experience where we simply attend services, receive information, and remain disconnected from the life of the church. Throughout the New Testament, believers are encouraged to love one another, care for one another, encourage one another, pray for one another, and serve one another faithfully.

The Bible says:

**“As each one has received a gift,
minister it to one another,
as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.”
– 1 Peter 4:10 NKJV**

Every believer matters in the life of the church.

Some people serve publicly by teaching, leading, singing, or helping direct ministries. Others serve behind the scenes through prayer, encouragement, hospitality, setup, cleaning, technical support, caring for children, helping families, or simply making themselves available wherever there is need. All of it matters to the Lord.

Serving is not ultimately about filling positions or keeping programs running. It is about loving Christ and loving people faithfully.

One of the amazing things about serving is that God not only works through our service, but also in us through the process of serving. As we faithfully make ourselves available to the Lord, He often uses serving to stretch us, mature us, teach us, humble us, strengthen us, and deepen our love for both Him and others.

Many people think they need to fully discover their gifts, calling, or long-term direction before they begin serving. But often God reveals those things gradually while we are already faithfully serving wherever there is need. Sometimes the clearest way to discover how God may want to use your life is simply by beginning to serve faithfully wherever there is need and remaining teachable along the way.

Serving is also one of the ways we grow more connected to the church family. As we worship together, learn God’s Word together, pray together, and serve together, relationships deepen and spiritual growth often follows.

At Calvary Chapel Solid Rock, we believe healthy serving grows out of a healthy walk with the Lord.

Serving should never replace worship, fellowship, prayer, or learning God’s Word. Instead, it should flow from those things as part of a growing relationship with Christ.

We also believe faithfulness matters far more than visibility. Some of the most valuable servants in a church are people few others ever notice — faithful people who consistently pray, encourage, help, support others, and quietly care for the needs of the church over time.

Jesus said:

**“Whoever desires to become great
among you, let him be your servant.”**

– Matthew 20:26 NKJV

In God’s kingdom, greatness is not measured by status, recognition, or platform, but by humility, faithfulness, and love.

If you sense the Lord stirring your heart toward serving, we encourage you to take that seriously. Pray about it. Remain open and teachable. Be willing to grow over time. You do not need to have everything figured out before taking a simple step of faith. God has a long history of doing extraordinary things through ordinary people who are simply willing to be faithful.
