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GETTING CONNECTED

One of the most important parts of spiritual growth is becoming connected to the life of a healthy church family.

When someone places their faith in Jesus Christ, they are not only brought into relationship with the Lord, but are also brought into relationship with other believers. Throughout the New Testament, the Christian life is consistently lived out in community as believers worship together, grow together, serve together, encourage one another, and help one another continue following the Lord faithfully.

The church was never meant to be simply a place we occasionally attend or passively observe. God designed His people to grow together as a family of believers centered around Jesus Christ.

At Calvary Chapel Solid Rock, we believe spiritual growth happens best when people remain consistently connected to the life of the church through worship, prayer, fellowship, discipleship, serving, and the teaching of God's Word.

This means church is not merely about consuming information or attending services anonymously. Healthy church life involves learning to invest ourselves into the community God has placed us in through our time, abilities, care for others, faithfulness, encouragement, generosity, and willingness to grow together.

As we consistently spend time around one another, relationships naturally deepen. We begin learning how to encourage each other, pray for one another, care for one another, and walk through life together as part of the body of Christ.

This is especially important in a culture where many people are isolated, disconnected, or trying to live the Christian life alone. While some people naturally tend to be more quiet or independent, God never intended believers to grow in complete isolation from other Christians.

We all need encouragement, accountability, support, wisdom, prayer, and spiritual family around us.

At the same time, getting connected does not happen overnight. Relationships, trust, and spiritual community usually develop gradually through consistent involvement over time.

One of the simplest and most important ways to become connected is faithful attendance. The more consistently we worship, learn God's Word, pray, and spend time together, the more opportunity there is for genuine relationships and spiritual growth to develop naturally.

We also encourage people to take simple steps toward involvement:

- spend time talking with others after services
- meet pastors and ministry leaders
- visit the Welcome Center
- learn about ministry opportunities
- participate in discipleship opportunities
- serve where there is need
- remain open to building relationships within the church family
